

Camp Rotary is a venue where campers can be themselves; try new activities, experience successes and failures, all in the safety of the camp environment. Another 2012 highlight for Easter Seals NB was honouring two of our longstanding board members, Keith Allen and Dr. Bruce Lockhart.
